


East Marsh Island Marsh Creation (TV-21)

Coastal Wetlands Planning, Protection and Restoration Act 2012 Land-Water Classification





The land-water data were obtained from digital imagery (Z/I Imaging digital mapping camera) with 1-meter resolution, acquired November 8, 2012. All areas characterized by emergent vegetation, upland, wetland forest or scrub-shrub were classified as land, while open water, aquatic beds and mudflats were classified as water.


